

A Message from the Interim Priest

O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, That mourns in lonely exile here, until the Son of God appears. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Can you believe that it is November 28th? Today is the first Sunday of Advent. Advent...the season of waiting...waiting and praying; a season of anticipation, expectation, as we await Christ's birth... a time of preparation...waiting upon the Lord.

With the secular world ramped up from Black Friday and onwards, with the music cranked in the malls, with the hardships going on around us, with the climate catastrophies (please pray for British Columbia and elsewhere) and the violence and uncertainty in the world, with the pressures brought on by COVID, it may be difficult to quiet our hearts and minds, to be present to the coming of our Lord. As we wait and wonder and we wander.

We, as a church, choose to use the ritual around the advent wreath to help us focus in Advent. The advent wreath appears in our church (and many of our homes). The candles we light each Sunday represent Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. On the First Sunday of Advent, a blue candle is lit to celebrate Hope, the inspiring and uplifting hope that Christ among us represents. On the Second Sunday of Advent, another blue candle is lit to celebrate Peace, both the Prince of Peace himself and the promise of peace on Earth. On the third Sunday of Advent, a pink candle is lit to celebrate joy, the joy the shepherds received at hearing the news of Christ's birth, or the joy that God brings in our lives. As the coming of Christ draws near, the final blue candle is lit on the Fourth Sunday of Advent to celebrate Love, both God's boundless love for us and our love for one another. And finally on Christmas Eve we light the centre candle, the Christ Candle. The Christ Candle is white to celebrate the purity of Jesus and the joy felt on this day. The light of the candles takes back the darkness and declares God's love and Jesus' presence in a world that can seem dark. The light represents our faith.

As we journey through Advent together, as we wait for the Lord together, let us pray for one another and share Hope, Peace, Joy and Love with each other and with the world. Let it be a season when we remember how much we are loved. Let this be a season of transformation in our lives and in the lives of those with whom we have contact.
